MEANS OF TRANSPORT IN MÁLAGA

From Málaga Airport to the City Centre

Málaga offers **train, metro, bus, taxi and ride-hailing services** from the airport to the centre and vice versa.

Train (Cercanías C1)

The C1 Málaga-Fuengirola train line runs every 20 minutes. You must take the **train to Malaga**. Once on the train, it will take approximately 10 to 15 minutes to reach the **Vialia - María Zambrano Station stop**.

The price of a single ticket is 3-4€ approximately.

- **If you are at María Zambrano and want to go to a hotel in the city centre:**

Once you are at María Zambrano Station -*intercambiador metropolitano*-, you can take the **L1 metro line** towards **Atarazana**. The metro station is located inside the shopping centre itself, and there are directions on how to get there from the cercanías train station.

- **If you are at María Zambrano and your hotel is close to the event venue:**
Once you are at María Zambrano Station -*intercambiador metropolitano*-, you can take the **L2 metro line** towards **Palacio de Deportes**. The metro station is located inside the shopping centre itself, and there are directions on how to get there from the cercanías train station.
You will have to get off at the penultimate stop called **Puerta Blanca**. It will take approximately 20 minutes to get to that stop.



Bus

Another option available is **bus line A** that will take you from the airport to [Estación de autobuses de Málaga](#) (next to Vialia – María Zambrano). This will also drop you off at the Vialia shopping centre – María Zambrano Station, and you will find the metro stop right next to it.

Taxi


The airport taxi rank can be found just **on the right** when exiting through the terminal-guided exit gates. They will simply have to tell them that they are heading to your Hotel.

The cost will be around 20-30€, although it could be more depending on traffic.

UBER / Cabify / Freenow

The taxi rank is on the left as you exit the arrivals terminal, in the car park next to the suburban train station. The trip will take about 20 minutes approximately. These trips are requested through the apps of each company. The cost will be around 15 to 20 euros, although it may vary.

Where is each of the transport services located?






ACCOMODATION





THINGS TO DO IN MÁLAGA

Some interesting activities to do in Málaga are:

- **Walk around Muelle Uno (Port of Málaga):**

Muelle Uno, with the best views of Málaga, is an earthly paradise in the Port of Málaga. This innovative commercial space open to the sea offers a unique experience with shops, leisure and restaurants.

- **Marqués de Larios Street:**

The pedestrian street Marqués de Larios, in the centre of Málaga, is ideal for shopping. Named in honour of the Marquis of Larios, promoter of the textile industry in the 19th century, it has a rich history. Currently closed to traffic, the street attracts many pedestrians with its boutiques, shoe stores, restaurants, cafes, and almond stalls. The ice cream parlour La Casa Mira, opened since 1890, stands out. Works by renowned sculptors are also on display. In addition, during the year, the street hosts cultural events, with decorations of lights and jasmine, and flamenco music and dance shows.

- **Visit the Alcazaba, Teatro Romano and Castillo de Gibralfaro:**

The Moorish Alcazaba of Málaga is connected to the Castle of Gibralfaro by La Coracha, a defensive wall. In Arabic, "alcazaba" means 'walled fortified enclosure', housing barracks, prisons and administrative buildings.

The Teatro Romano of Málaga has a history linked to the Alcazaba, as it was used as a quarry for its construction. During the ascent from Alcazabilla street, you can see details of the theatre, as Arab builders reused rocks, capitals and marble between 1057 and 1063 AD.

The Castillo de Gibralfaro is a Nasrid fortress of the 14th century. It was built to defend the Alcazaba, located at its feet, and its name comes from Mount Jabal-Faruk, which means 'mountain of the lighthouse'.

- **Catamaran Tour:**

Catamarán Mundo Marino and Fly Blue are 2 providers of catamaran tours. Enjoy a unique experience on these sailing boats that will allow you to enjoy the bay, the dolphins and a spectacular sunset. The cost of the tour is around 12 to 25 euros.

- **Pedregalejo and the popular “Espetos”:**

With the rising temperatures, the desire of many to dip their toes in the water and taste the famous sardine skewer, one of the typical dishes of the beach bars found along the Costa del Sol, increases even more. Over the years, some of these beach restaurants have become undisputed points of reference for this type of grilled cuisine: Las Acacias, Miguelito El Cariñoso, El Caleño, among others.

- **Museums:**

Another more cultural option would be to visit the most important museums in the city. These are the Museo Carmen Thyssen, the Museo Picasso and the Pompidou.
